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About the **NORTH EAST VALLEY** Division of General Practice

The North East Valley Division of General Practice (NEVDGP) was created in 1993 to improve health outcomes for patients by encouraging General Practitioners to work together with other health professionals to upgrade the quality of health service delivery at the local level.

Divisions are also involved in the rollout of national health initiatives. Divisions are funded by the Commonwealth Department of Health and Ageing and are independently governed bodies. The peak national body representing the 119 Divisions of General Practice is the Australian General Practice Network (AGPN).

The NEVDGP is made up of 250 GP members working in 76 practices. The GPs in the area are responsible for more than 232,000 residents. The Division covers the local government areas of Banyule, Nillumbik and portions of Darebin.

Membership is open to all General Practitioners. There is no joining fee or ongoing membership cost.
